Success Tips #2

Setting Goals for Your Voice Over Career

Whether a beginner or a seasoned veteran, setting goals is absolutely vital.

Golden Goal Rules:

1. Be specific. Saying you want success is too vague. Saying you want a demo, an agent and six jobs this year is realistic.
2. Set a target date. If you plan on mailing 50 demos, set a target date to get them in the mail.
3. Put it in writing. Once written, it's easier to stay committed to your goals.
4. Aim high ... but don't aim so high that it's unrealistic. Booking ten jobs your first year is within reach. Booking 100 jobs may be hard to accomplish. Instead, increase your goals each year.
5. Spend time thinking about who, what, why, how, and when. In other words, identify obstacles and people who can help you overcome them.
